### Andrew Lincoln, ScD, MS

Director, MedStar Sports Medicine Research Center  
Associate Professor, Department of Rehabilitation Medicine  
Georgetown University Medical Center

Dr. Lincoln is the research director of the MedStar Sports Medicine program in the Baltimore-Washington area and associate professor of rehabilitation medicine at Georgetown Medical Center. He specializes in the epidemiology of sports-related injuries and performs research for the US Lacrosse Sports Science & Safety Committee and the NFL Medical Committee. He has a bachelor's degree in Engineering Science & Mechanics from Virginia Tech, a master's degree in Biomedical Engineering from Louisiana Tech, and a doctorate in injury epidemiology from Johns Hopkins University.

His current research projects investigate:

- head inspect exposures and concussion mechanisms in youth sports
- trends in sports-related concussion incidence at the high school level
- participation and injury risk in youth sports
- mortality in former professional football players
- echocardiography characteristics of elite football players
- cardiac concerns in ultra-endurance athletes, and
- orthopedic outcomes in athletes
